Respect

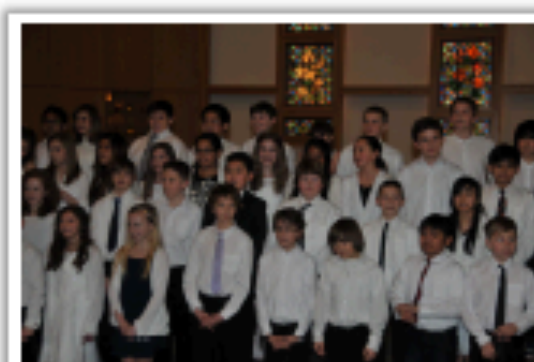
