- Thursday, February 7 – Mac & Cheese for \$3.00



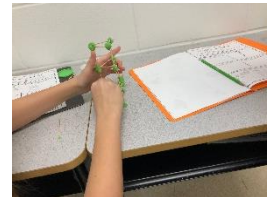
DANCE KREATIONS

CTF OPTION – SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING & MATHEMATICS

In the STEM Challenges CTF option students have been learning to make a plan before they start building and how to revise their plan and troubleshoot as they build. In teams of 3 students were challenged to make the longest paper chain using only 2 pieces of construction paper and 30cm of masking tape. This week, in pairs, students had 100 toothpicks and one small plastic container of modelling dough to build the tallest tower.



CTF OPTION – HELPING HANDS GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP

In our CTF group, Helping Hands/Global Citizenship, we have been learning about local and global poverty. Poverty means living without one or more of your basic needs. We have discussed that anyone might experience poverty or homelessness as there are many different factors that influence a person having their needs met. As part of our learning, we completed a simulation as a class in which we were challenged to live for 1 month with the last \$1000 in our bank account. As a class we were faced with tough choices and came to a better understanding of the difficulties many people face daily.
