Instrumental Music (Band) 8/9

Sports Performance 8/9



Sports performance gives recreational/competitive student athletes a chance to learn a wide variety of knowledge, skills, and attitudes that nurture the development of physical, cultural, social, and emotional potential through sporting endeavors. The focus of the course is on an in-depth look at understanding the factors related to sports performance.
