Please keep in mind that students last day of school is on December 21st and all will return to school on January 7th. Please enjoy the much deserved break.

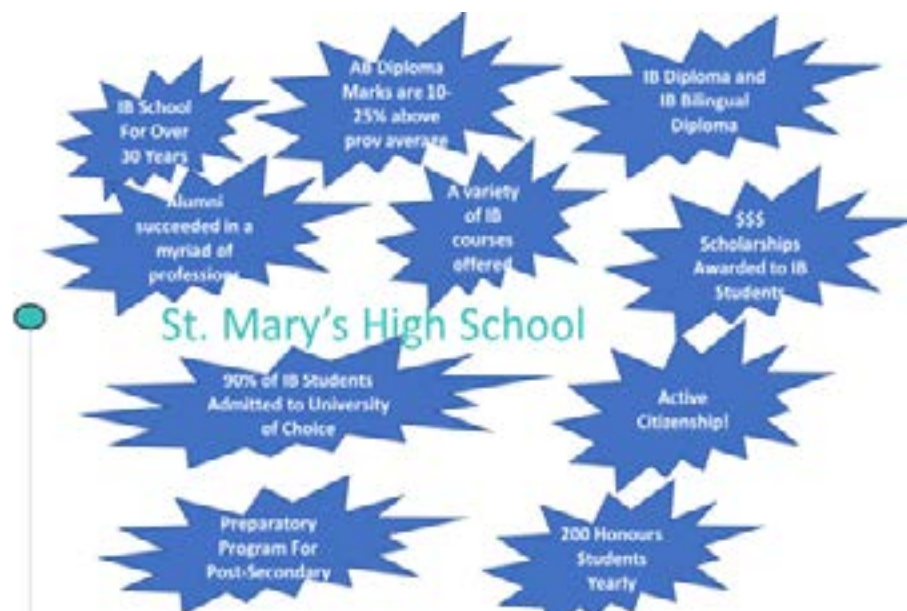

Mental Health – All Counsellors

All students can make appointments with Counsellors through our Administrative Assistant Mrs. Carmen Delgado in the Counselling office. Students can see us for personal, academic and post-secondary concerns. Each student has a designated Counsellor assigned to them by their T.A. Our Counsellors are trained teachers with Master's in this field. We see students throughout the year for various issues; course planning, stress, anxiety, grief and many other issues.

Online and Self Directed Courses

Any students enrolled in the above courses from St. Anne's must ensure that their course work is completed by the beginning of January 2019. Students need to see Ms. Polivchuk in the Exam Centre to complete quizzes and exams. Students enrolled with ADLC, must ensure that they follow the deadlines given by their online teacher with that system.

2nd Semester registration for these courses will begin in February. Students are allowed to register for one online course if they have a spare or are missing a critical subject needed to graduate. All students must complete a registration form with their Counsellor and then be approved by Mr. McKenty our Vice Principal.

Graduation – Checklist for Grade 12's to do

Grade 12 students who wish to graduate this year must ensure that they have the required courses and 100 credits. They may need to book an appointment with Mrs. Huvenaars, our Career Practitioner to understand the process for applying to Post-Secondary Institution.

We had a meeting in September with parents and students to go over many of these concerns. We have also sent out emails to all students in grade 12 to begin their credit checks in order to receive an Alberta High School Diploma. Students and their parents must do the following:

1. **Register with MY PASS – myPass.alberta.ca This site gives you access to your transcript**
2. **Check your Learn Account for the Grad Check list form. Complete it and meet with your TA for a review on December 5th and 6th.**
3. **Meet with their assigned Counsellor for any questions or concerns**

Career Planning – Mrs. Huvenaars – Career Centre Room S100

Any students requiring assistance with finding a career path can book an appointment by signing into the appointment book at the Career Centre. Parents are welcome to email our Career Practitioner, susan.huvenaars@cssd.ab.ca. Mrs. Huvenaars can work with students individually on their career plans. She is available Tuesdays, Wednesdays and alternate Fridays for appointments in the Career Center.

All grade 12 students graduating and going to post-secondary institutions outside of Alberta, must go through the "MYPASS" site to order and send your transcripts from Alberta Education. Please follow all directions from the schools to which you have applied.

Scholarships – Mrs. Vant Erve

There are many out of school scholarships that students in grade 12 can apply for. A booklet has been created for students and they can access this information on the Brightspace (D2L) platform where they have their marks. Our Internal Scholarships, St. Mary's High School gives out scholarships every year. This scholarship form will come out in March and is specifically geared for our graduating grade 12 students that have been at St. Mary's for a minimum of 2 years. Students need to book appointments through Mrs. Delgado, in the Counselling office, to review any scholarship applications.

Diploma Prep

Any student writing a Diploma in grade 11 or 12 can sign up for a Diploma Preparation course with the District. Cost is \$75 per course and gives the student 12 hours of instruction. Register online at: www.cssd.ab.ca/academicservice or call 403-500-2012 ext. 412.

St. Mary's Environmental Action Team

The St. Mary's Environmental Action Team is comprised of students committed to providing recycling services to the school community while also encouraging sustainability in the building. Over the years, the club has primarily provided beverage container and paper recycling. More recently, in respecting the City of Calgary Bylaw to regulate and manage waste, the club slowly integrated composting. The students have educated themselves on the science of how a landfill works and why waste diversion is both the responsible and economical choice.

The club has begun targeting special events at school where there is significant waste generated. Inspired by waste diversion strategies employed at festivals and large gatherings, the students direct attendees to either compost, recycle, or dispose of materials. In so doing, St. Mary's remains accountable to the Bylaw, increasingly responsible for its waste, and models positive behavior to its student-citizens.

Ultimately, the students of the Environmental Action Team want St. Mary's to align with the Pope's Encyclical on the Environment. Practically this means converting traditional garbage cans to waste diversion stations as they have seen in CBE schools where one can make a recycling or composting choice. Further, the team members hope to encourage less use of plastic in the cafeteria and at special events in favour of a "bring-your-own" attitude of sustainability where re-use is common and compostable items become the norm.

This generation of club members is devoted to leaving a legacy of visible and authentic change in the halls of St. Mary's.

Kananaskis Trip 2018 with Biology 35IB HL

Fun fact: the Biology 35 IBHL class of 2018 almost never made it to this trip. But don't worry, we were able to find a noble driver to transport us to Kananaskis Country; where our quest took place.

Upon arrival, we checked our rooms, expecting dingy dorm rooms; instead it was touchscreen pads and modern hardwood floors that gave it a comfortable feeling that comes with the cottage life. Guiding our extravaganza were expert biologists; Sue and Savanna, they were capable of presenting invertebrates and rivers in a way so interesting, that it inspired one of our classmates to focus her entire individual research project on what was explored.

Our first expedition lead us to Ribbon Creek, in K-country. Here, we were given the freedom of collecting our very own data with sophisticated equipment. From capturing invertebrates, to measuring the mineral concentrations; it's safe to say we gained valuable experience on what it's like to be a researcher in the great outdoors. Once our rubber boots were filled to the rim with the river water, we knew it was time to head back to the facility for data analysis. The "hands-on" analysis involved the observation of the collected invertebrates under dissecting scopes and then used various methods to calculate population counts.

On our second day as scientists, we headed into an aspen and spruce forest. Here we took soil samples, observed different plant species, and even discovered the age of the trees around us by sampling the cross core. We now understand how everything in nature is interrelated with each other but, most importantly we learned how to blend in to our surroundings with a quick, but very competitive, game of camouflage.

The insight both of the female biologists gave on how research is conducted in the real world truly opened our eyes: not all research follows the scientific system methodically, contrary to what's taught (no shade @Lee). They taught us it was okay to be creative on how we conduct our research and answer our questions, but also accept that failure is in the process and isn't always bad. Not to mention, the food served by the excellent chefs successfully fueled our scientific cravings. Putting our ideas together and working as a team made the experience more memorable. Through the challenges we faced in the scientific process, we were able to form stronger bonds with each other, bonds that probably wouldn't have happened otherwise.
