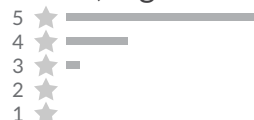

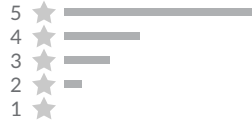

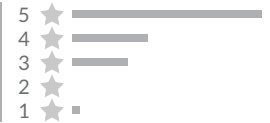

Students need to learn about faith in supportive communities in order to have the information needed to make their own decisions later on

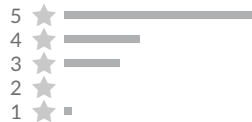

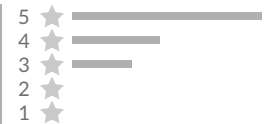

when you teach kids to love others, you are providing them with a tool to lead a good life full of positivity towards thier community and peers.

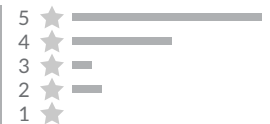

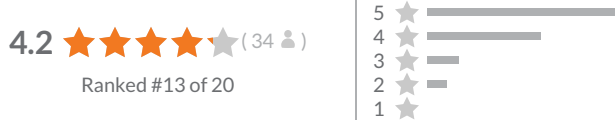

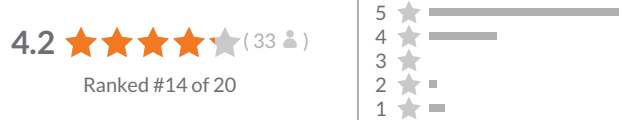
To help all students know God and make connections with Him.

The more connections we have with God (not just in the home or church), students see the importance of God in our lives.



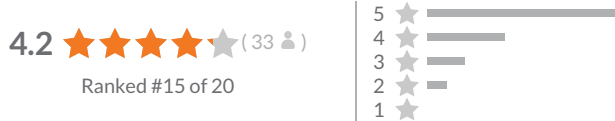
It allows us to answer God's call

To be bigger than ourselves.



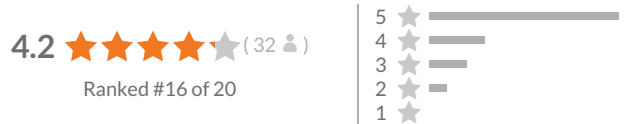
Learning through the Catholic faith provides a worldview based on mercy, compassion, justice and love.

In a sometimes secular world, it is important for students to understand Jesus' vision of humanity.



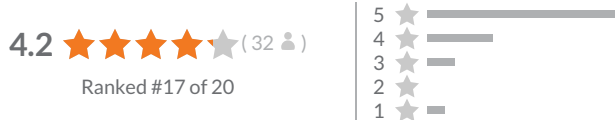
Social Justice

We can embed core values of social justice and morality into our students, in fact it is our call to do so.



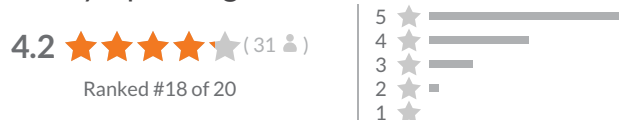
We want our students to be firmly grounded in all round wellness: social, intellectual, emotional and spiritual.
