Year-End Progress Report Information:

As we have reached the end of the 2019-2020 school year, we want to thank you for your support, especially during these past few months of learning at home. As shared earlier this month, your child's progress report will be shared with you through a secure code that will be emailed to you directly. This will occur sometime during the last week of instruction. If you do not receive the progress report by June 26, please let the school know and we will make alternative arrangements for you to receive the progress report.

As a reminder, the following assessment considerations have been made during this learning at home time period.

- For kindergarten, the format and grading systems will remain the same, with areas of focus on literacy, numeracy and religion. The use of the asterisk will denote areas not assessed.
- For elementary, standard grading systems will continue to be used on the progress report, with new term 3 assessments for only LA, Math and Religion. All other courses will have term 2 marks continued.

Work habits were not assessed in term 3 for any grade level. A comment will appear on the progress report to indicate the learning at home environment due to the COVID pandemic. Comments about student learning will only be issued for assessed subject areas.

School-Borrowed Chromebook and Textbook Return:

On **Wednesday, June 24th** the school will be collecting ALL Chromebooks and textbooks borrowed for at-home learning. This schedule indicates when your child is to drop off the technology on that day. If you wish to drop the technology off at an earlier date, please just contact the school to let us know when you will be returning the items. Items not returning may lead to the family being fined for the replacement costs of the technology! (Each Chromebook is valued at \$365.00 to replace)

Looking Forward to the 2020-21 School Year, please read: (although we do not have a directive from Alberta Education and Alberta Health Services, these are consideration you must be aware of:

- Food may not be provided at school – parents must send students with food from home
- Children must be able to open their snacks independently
- If child is exhibiting any symptoms or complaining of feeling unwell child is to stay home
- Send a mask to school with your child (cloth masks should be washed daily, and disposable masks must be replaced each day with a fresh one)
- Send a small gel sanitizer in the backpack so child can sanitize hands regularly (AHS approved brand)
- Students cannot share items - Children must have their own learning tools
- No personal books, toys, balls, games from home
- Maintain physical distance on the school grounds remaining 2 meters apart from other families and children
- Parents must have a phone number that can be called in case your child becomes symptomatic at school and you must come and take them home during the school day
- Parents must have a plan to have a child picked up from the school during the day if they become sick
- Childcare **will need to be in place** as students may not attend school for full days and all school days in each week (*for example*: students may only attend classes from 8:30-1:30 on 2 days of the week with on-line learning occurring on days at home)
